Social workers

Some people said it was difficult to get hold of their social worker. Steve Hook wanted more information to be able to address this point.



Frances Sulikosky explained that it was a mother trying to get hold of her son's social worker. Steve Hook said there is a single contact for social work that you can call or email if they need to.

Steve said that there has been an issue with hiring enough social workers and getting them to stay in their jobs. This has affected people. The council is trying to make the job a good option for people so they can fix this issue.



If this problem kept happening, people can also make a complaint.

Bus passes

People said it was confusing that different parts of Sussex have different rules for the disability bus card. Steve Castellari said Brighton and Hove get carers discounted on the carer's card.



But if you go into East or West Sussex the rules are different for who goes free and when.

Frances Sulikosky will talk to Victoria Garcia about the Brighton and Hove rules and why they are different. The Link Group will continue to look at the issue to see if we can make it simpler to travel between the different places.

Amaze Presentation about their Transitions Consultation





Jem Hadert from Amaze and Fiona England from the Parent Carer's Council told us about the big consultation they had done with their young people about transitioning into adulthood.





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Jane Viner said she would like to talk to them both more about the information about health. She had met with a Paediatrician and Adults Clinical Lead for Learning Disabilities and Social Care Transitions workers and they had talked about some of these issues.

Karen Kimberly said that they have been working on rebuilding links with children's services. She will keep Fiona updated.



Steve Hook said the health part of transitioning into adulthood was one of the things they will deal with in the new transitions plan, as people went from having their own specific paediatrician (children's doctor) to getting less support in adulthood.



Jess Harper said that they need to consider how they promote the local offer when updating the easy read information on the Council website. It is currently on the children's services page.

Update from the Health and Wellbeing working group



Karen Kimberly gave an update about what the Health and Wellbeing working group had been doing recently.





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One of the updates was about a new weight management support service called 'Thrive Tribe'.

Jane Viner said they are working with them to make sure it is accessible. She will send out information when they are set up.



Some people with learning disabilities said the old weight management service had not been very accessible or helpful.



Abby Lonsdale said that Oliver McGowan training for NHS staff should improve most staff's understanding of people with learning disabilities. It is starting in Sussex at the moment.

Update from the Activities Work and Learning working group



Mikey Price and Cameron Brown gave an update about what the Activities, Work and Learning working group had been doing recently.





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Simona Giunta from West Sussex said that activities was one of the main things that was concerning people at their partnership board too. She would like to learn from our work.




Action

Presentation about the LeDeR program and heart health work



Abby Lonsdale presented about the work that LeDeR do learning from the lives and deaths of people with learning disabilities.





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Vanessa De Guzman asked about the vaccination clinics that the NHS had run during lockdown. She said they were really good, but didn't happen this year so people missed out.



Jane Viner said that there had been problems with the vaccine program this year, and that it depends on the national vaccination program. She is hoping it will be better next year.



Danielle Garrett from Speak Out presented about the 'Cardiovascular Disease Prevention' work that Speak Out has been doing with the NHS.





There are lots of resources and trainings to use and share.

Naomi Cox said that they are really worried about the council's new budget coming up and wanted a chance to talk about it as a meeting.

Fiona England agreed and talked about how important it would be for the local politicians to hear from providers about how savings / service cuts will impact the people they support.



Steve Hook said that politicians are informed by advisors like him and other council members that are part of the meeting, so they do hear from the partnership board in that way.
