Vaccinations and the Learning Disability Register

Shannon Caldwell from Speak Out and Sally Polanski from Amaze gave a presentation about how the learning disability register helps people get good health care including Covid jabs.

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To be a priority for the jab you need to be on your doctor's Learning Disability register. Some people still not on the register. This means they don't get the other help they need to stay healthy either:

- Extra time
- Reasonable adjustments
- A health check every year
- Accessible information.

Luci: 'My doctor's did not know about the register.'

The Health Facilitator is working to train office staff in doctors so that they know about the register.

Diana: 'My son is autistic, the surgery put him on the register and he was able to get his vaccination.'

Some people with autism have been put on the register so they get the support they need. An autism register would be helpful for people who need support but do not have a learning disability. learning disability register.

Speak Out and Grace Eyre will share CCG information about vaccinations.

Speak Out will support the CCG to make sure that their information is accessible.

Speak Out will ask people with learning disabilities about good experiences of being on the register.

Speak Out will ask people with learning disabilities about their health checks. What were they like?





Covid Vaccinations

Lily Kennard from the CCG (Clinical Commissioning Group for health care) Told us about what they are doing to make Covid vaccinations easier for people with learning disabilities.

 Quiet vaccination sessions where people can have more support and time. Everyone will share information about quiet vaccination sessions.

People can contact Lilly with ideas for where the Mobile







- Easy read information.
- Mobile vaccination units a bit like ambulances. People can just turn up and have their vaccination.

She also wanted to know if people had questions about the vaccine.

People said they were worried about getting their second dose.

Others said that they were anxious about side effects. Who do you contact if you are worried?

vaccination units should go.

She would also like to hear what more can be done to make things better.

Isolation during Covid

The Link Group wanted to tell the Partnership Board about how the last year has changed life for people with learning disabilities.

Shannon Caldwell gave a presentation about how Covid has affected them.

- People have been lonely and scared.
- Their mental health has suffered badly.
- They have lost skills and confidence.
- Some say they have not had the support they need.

Speak Out will ask people what skills they have lost.

Speak Out will ask people what support they need to get out and about again.







 People say they will need extra support when things start to open up again.

Naomi Cox from Grace Eyre said they are doing contact work with people who went back to live with their families during Covid19. The Friendship Group are meeting up outside.

Diana Boyd from The Parent Carers' Council said it would be good to find out what skills people have lost. They might also have missed some education.

We talked about how to weigh up the risk of Covid19 and the risk of isolation damaging mental health.

Lou Aish will find out what plans the council have to support people with this.

We will continue to talk about this issue as restrictions lift.
